Utah Pioneer, 91, Dies in L. A. Hospital

Mrs. Sarah Walsh Swift, 91, former Salt Lake resident, died Tuesday at 10:45 p.m. in a Los Angeles hospital of causes incident to age, according to word received here by relatives.

An early Utah pioneer, Mrs. Swift moved to Los Angeles three years ago because of ill health.



Born Nov. 19, Mrs. Swift 1855, in Overdarwen, England, a daughter of William and Alice F. Bury Walsh, she came to Utah in 1856 with her parents, who were converts to the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Mrs. Swift was an active member of the LDS church, having served as counselor in the presidency of the Tenth LDS ward Relief society. She also served as president, Handcart Daughters of Pioneers group and of the ward's DUP chapter.

She was married to William Swift June 6, 1877, in the Salt Lake LDS Endowment house. He died in 1884.

Survivors include two daughters, Miss Pearl Swift and Mrs. T. W. Condie, Salt Lake City; two grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be conducted Saturday at 2 p.m. at 260 E. South Temple, where friends may call Friday from 4 to 8 p.m. and Saturday prior to services. Burial will be in Salt Lake City cemetery.
